Objectives and investment policy

The Fund seeks compliance with investment principles which are in accordance with Shariah. The Fund seeks to maximize total return over the medium to long term through a combination of capital growth and income by investing in global Shariah-compliant fixed income securities (Sukuk).

The Fund invests primarily in a diversified portfolio of Sukuk issued by government, government-related entities such as their local authorities and public authorities, corporate or supranational entities located globally. They comprise mortgage, asset-backed securities and collateralized financing obligations, zero-coupon Sukuk and coupon bearing Sukuk; convertible Sukuk; contingent convertible securities; private placements; CIS and ETF.

Investments are limited to markets where the regulatory authority is an ordinary or associate member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) - further details of which are set out in www.iosco.org.

The Fund expects to invest a minimum of 70% of the Fund's Net Asset Value in Sukuk that may be USD denominated and non-USD denominated, investment grade or below investment grade or non-rated and may be fixed or floating rate, of which up to 20% of the Fund's Net Asset Value may be invested in asset backed securities.

The Fund has the ability to invest in Shariah-compliant bank deposits, money market funds and treasury bills (up to 100% of the Fund net assets).

The Fund can also invest in derivatives structured in accordance with Shariah principles.

While it is generally intended for the Fund to be fully invested at all times, there may be a portion of assets held in cash or deposits at any given time.

The Fund will be managed without reference to a particular benchmark. The sub-investment adviser may make discretionary choices when deciding which investments should be held by the Fund subject to the Fund's objective and investment policy and restrictions.

You may buy and sell Shares on any Business Day subject to the terms set out in the section entitled "Dealing Day" of the Fund's supplement (which together with the prospectus constitute the Prospectus).

• The following are risks materially relevant that are not captured by the SRRI:

 Sukuk Investment Risk – Like for other fixed income securities, price changes in Sukuk are influenced predominantly by interest rate developments in the capital markets, which in turn are influenced by macro-economic factors.

Liquidity risk: The risk that arises when adverse market conditions affect the ability to sell assets when necessary. Reduced liquidity may have a negative impact on the price of the assets

Contingent Capital Securities risk - is given by the substantially greater risk that these instruments may have compared to other forms of securities in times of credit stress and may result in a material loss to the Fund depending on certain trigger events. Events such as breaching a predetermined issued capital ratio or determination by a regulator may lead to a partial or total loss of value, or alternatively a conversion to equity of the issuing company that may have already seen a reduction in value.

Mortgage and Asset-Backed Securities carry greater risk compared to other securities in times of market stress such as early payment and/or extension of the life of the underlying assets.

Derivative instruments risk - Counterparty, position, liquidity, settlement, correlation and legal risk are specific risks associated with the use of derivative instruments.
